
Padma Awards 2024

Padma Awards - one of the highest civilian Awards of the country, are conferred in three categories, namely, Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri. The Awards are given in various disciplines/fields of activities. The awards are announced on the occasion of Republic Day every year.

This year, the President of India at ceremonial functions presented the awards on 22 April at Rashtrapati Bhawan. For 2024, the President has approved the conferment of 132 Padma Awards including 2 duo cases (in a duo case, the Award is counted as one). The list comprises 5 Padma Vibhushan, 17 Padma Bhushan and 110 Padma Shri Awards. 30 of the awardees are women and the <u>list</u> also includes 8 persons from the category of Foreigners/NRI/PIO/OCI and 9 Posthumous awardees.

Notable recipients of the Padma Awards this year include:


Former Vice President of India, Muppavarapu Venkaiah Naidu conferred with Padma Vibhushan for his outstanding contributions to public affairs.



India's growth forecast for 2024 raised by ADB and IMF

ADB has upgraded India's GDP growth <u>forecast</u> for fiscal year (FY) 2024 ending on 31 March 2025 from 6.7% to 7% and 7.2% in FY2025, driven by robust public and private investment and strong services sector.

On the same note, the International Monetary Fund's latest World Economic Outlook revised India's economic growth projection for fiscal year April 2024-March 2025 to 6.8% from 6.5% and for the fiscal year 2023-24 to 7.8% from 6.7%.

India's overall exports are estimated to surpass last year's highest record





Despite facing persistent global challenges, India's overall exports, encompassing both merchandise and services, are expected to surpass the previous year's peak, reaching an estimated US\$ 776.68 billion in the fiscal year 2024, slightly edging out the US\$ 776.40 billion recorded in the previous fiscal year. Notably, March 2024 marked the highest monthly merchandise exports of the current fiscal year, totalling US\$ 41.68 billion.

These figures underscore the resilience of India's export sector amidst global challenges and highlight the ongoing efforts to strengthen trade dynamics and balance.

India adds record 18 GW renewable energy capacity in FY24



India achieved а significant milestone in renewable energy capacity addition, with a recordbreaking 18.48 GW added in 2023-24, marking a 21% increase from previous year. However, the industry experts emphasize the need for sustained efforts, suggesting an annual addition of at least 50 GW over the next six years to meet the ambitious target of 500 GW of renewables by 2030.



As of March 31, 2024, India's installed renewable energy capacity stands at 143.64 GW, excluding large hydropower projects. Solar leads the overall renewable energy capacity with 81.81 GW, followed by wind energy at approximately 46 GW, biomass cogeneration at 9.43 GW, and small hydro at 5 GW.

Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile successfully flight-tested by DRDO

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) conducted a successful flight-test of Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile (ITCM) from the Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the coast of Odisha on April 18, 2024. During the test, all subsystems performed as per expectation. The missile performance was monitored by several Range Sensors like Radar, Electro Optical Tracking System (EOTS) and Telemetry deployed by ITR at different locations to ensure complete coverage of the flight path. The flight of the missile was also monitored from the Su-30-Mk-I aircraft of the Indian Air Force.

MPATGM Weapon System tested successfully

Man Portable Anti-tank Guided Missile (MPATGM) Weapon System, indigenously designed and developed by Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO), has been field evaluated in different flight configurations several times with the objective of proving the technology with high superiority. The system consisted of the MPATGM, Launcher, Target Acquisition System, and the Fire Control Unit.



The Warhead Flight Trials were successfully conducted at the Pokhran Field Firing Range,

Rajasthan on April 13, 2024. Missile performance and warhead performance were found to be remarkable. With this, technology development and successful demonstration have been concluded and the system is now ready for Final User Evaluation Trials leading towards its induction into the Indian Army.


India showcases charm at VITM

ICG's Pollution Control Vessel Samudra Paheredar visits Vietnam







Indian Coast Guard (ICG) Pollution Control Vessel Samudra Paheredar, with an integral helicopter, made a port call at Ho Chi Minh City on 2 April as part of its ongoing overseas deployment to ASEAN countries. During the three-day visit, the crew engaged in professional interactions focusing on marine pollution response, maritime search & rescue, and maritime law enforcement. The activities also include cross-deck training, subject matter expert exchanges, sports events and passage exercise with the Vietnam Coast Guard (VCG).

The visit of the ICG specialised vessel to ASEAN countries is in pursuance with India ASEAN Initiative for marine pollution announced during ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting Plus in Cambodia in 2022. The deployment of Samudra Paheredar to the ASEAN region reflects India's shared concern and resolve towards marine pollution, promoting safety and security through maritime cooperation.

Kanha National Park



Home to the majestic royal Bengal tiger, the Kanha National Park is spread over an impressive area of 940 sq km. It is commonly believed that this park, with its lush green meadows and thick sal forests so enchanted the English author Rudyard Kipling that he used it as background for his iconic novel 'The Jungle Book'. The park also holds the distinction of bringing back the barasingha (swamp deer) from the brink of near extinction. The park is also home to other majestic animals like leopard and wild dogs. The award-winning National Geographic film, 'Land of the Tigers' was also shot here.

Considered to be one of the best managed parks in Asia, Kanha Tiger Reserve was created in 1974 as part of Project Tiger. The park is known for the stringent conservation programmes to preserve flora, fauna and the local eco-system.
